Reading: Matthew 14 verses 22 – 33 Jesus Walks on the Water. [The appointed Gospel lesson for Sunday 9th August]

22 Jesus immediately had the disciples get into a boat and cross to the other side ahead of him, while he sent the crowds away. 23 After dismissing the crowds, he went up on a hillside by himself to pray. When evening came, he was there alone. 24 By this time the boat was in the middle of the sea and was being battered by the waves, because the wind was against them. 25 Shortly before dawn Jesus came to them, walking on the sea. 26 When the disciples saw him walking on the sea, they were terrified and cried out, "It's a ghost!" And they screamed in terror. 27 "Have courage!" Jesus immediately told them. "It's me. Stop being afraid!" 28 Peter answered him, "Lord, if it's you, order me to come to you on the water." 29 Jesus said, "Come on!" So Peter got down out of the boat, started walking on the water, and came to Jesus. 30 But when he noticed the strong wind, he was frightened. As he began to sink, he shouted, "Lord, save me!" 31 At once Jesus reached out his hand, caught him, and asked him, "You who have so little faith, why did you doubt?" 32 As they got into the boat, the wind stopped blowing. 33 Then the men in the boat began to worship Jesus, saying, "You certainly are the Son of God!"

Barclay also records that a Bishop writing to a friend related this story and added, "So when your heart is distressed and agitated, put the Cross into its centre to keep it steady, in every time of storm and stress, the presence of Jesus brings serenity and calm."

The picture of the young girl placing a piece of wood on the water in her bucket to stopping it spilling can offer us the hope that remembering to have Jesus Christ at the centre of our turbulent lives is both reassuring and encouraging. But it struck me that just as the girl still had to carry the bucket home, so we have to, in trust and faith continue our faith journeys together through times of doubt and challenge, and we will sometimes be finding ourselves echoing the words of the man appealing to Jesus to help his sick son, "Lord, we believe; help our unbelief. Amen.
